- Empirical studies on the impact of Covid-19 on risk reporting, capital markets, etc.
- Corporate finance and valuation after Covid-19
- Risk awareness and risk behaviour differences related to Covid-19
- Investor behaviour during and after the crisis
- Risk management practices across the globe in response to the crisis
- Effectiveness of methods for risk assessment and risk management practices for a pandemic
- Psychological aspects of dealing with the pandemic
- The role of corporate culture and sub-cultures
- Corporate governance and risk culture
- Experimental studies in risk management
